- Preventing unnecessary emergency medical transports and emergency room visits
- Following up with patients after hospital discharge
- Preventing hospital admissions/readmissions
- Improving the overall health of our patients and communities

All duties performed are within the scope of the New Hampshire Nurse Practice Act and in collaboration with others.

Through collaboration with the Lebanon Community Paramedic, primary care providers, care managers, social service agencies, city municipalities, and the community the community nurses can address health inequities and gaps in care to improve health for people living in Lebanon, Enfield, and Grantham.

# WHO IS ELIGIBLE

## THIS PROGRAM IS FOR PATIENTS WHO MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- Age 18 years or older
- Resides in City of Lebanon (includes West Lebanon), Enfield or Grantham
- Identified medical need
- Able to participate in their own care (excludes dementia, severe persistent mental health), OR patient has a caregiver who can be present during visits
- Not actively receiving similar services from another organization (such as visiting nurse or hospice)

# COMMUNITY NURSE SERVICES PROVIDED:

- Care management and care transitions
- Chronic disease support
- Monitoring vital signs
- Medication reconciliation
- Home safety evaluations
- Other interventions within the nursing scope of practice
- Assisting with telehealth
- Connecting with care providers

# HOW TO REFER

Anyone can make a referral for a Community Nurse for themselves or another community member. If you have a primary care physician, talk to them about receiving a visit from a Lebanon Community Nurse.
